The elephant

Elephants are the largest land mammals. They are well-known for their trunks. The largest elephant ever weighed as much as 150 people together.

Fact: Elephants are the only mammals who cannot jump.

Food

Elephants eat leaves, fruit and branches. They use their trunk to get it off trees. They also pull roots from the ground to eat. And they like grass and tree bark.

Fact: Elephants eat around 180 to 200 kilos of food a day. The trunk sucks up 80 liters water a day and squirts it into the mouth.

Nature

Herd of elephants

Elephants live in groups. The group is called a herd. A female elephant is a cow and a male elephant is a bull. A young elephant is a calf. Male elephants live outside the herd and only join in during mating season.

Fact: Elephants live between 50 to 70 years.

Elephant trek

Elephants are always looking for food. Sometimes they must walk long distances to find something to eat. On their way they damage trees and bushes. The ground becomes bare ground. There is no shade left to take a rest. So the herd goes on with their search for food.

Teeth

Elephants have 26 teeth. The tusks count for 2. They lose and regrow their teeth six times in their lives. The molars are heavy and as big as bricks!

Fact: A tusk grows about 17 centimeters a year. But because of eating, fightin and working hard they don't get too long.

Trunk

A trunk has a lot of big and small muscles. Therefore, the trunk is strong and can move very smoothly. Elephants can catch a tree trunk as well as a nut. They also use the trunk for fighting. And they can smell with it.

Fact: Only elephants have trunks. They can smell other elephants from 5 kilometers away!

Skin

The elephant's skin is very thick. But the skin is very sensitive and can get sunburned. To protect their skin, they throw mud on it. It also keeps insects away. With their trunk elephants blow dustover their bodies so they don't get too warm.

Fact: Elephants flap their big ears to cool down.
